## A Man and a Fork

There was a young man who had been diagnosed with a terminal illness and had been given three months to live. So as he was getting his things 'in order,' he contacted his Priest and had him come to his house to discuss certain aspects of his final wishes.

He told him which songs he wanted sung at the service, what scriptures he would like read, and what outfit he wanted to be buried in. Everything was in order and the Priest was preparing to leave when the young man suddenly remembered something very important to him. 'There's one more thing,' he said excitedly. 'What's that?' came the Priest's reply. 'This is very important,' the young man continued. 'I want to be buried with a fork in my right hand.' The Priest stood looking at the young man, not knowing quite what to say. That surprises you, doesn't it?' the young man asked. 'Well, to be honest, I'm puzzled by the request,' said the Priest.

The young man explained. 'My grandmother once told me this story, and from that time on I have always tried to pass along its message to those I love and those who are in need of encouragement. In all my years of attending socials and dinners, I always remember that when the dishes of the main course were being cleared, someone would inevitably lean over and say, 'Keep your fork.' 'It was my favorite part because I knew that something better was coming ... like velvety chocolate cake or deep-dish apple pie. Something wonderful, and with substance!'

So, I just want people to see me there in that casket with a fork in my hand and I want them to wonder 'What's with the fork?' Then I want you to tell them: 'Keep your fork ... the best is yet to come.'

The Priest's eyes welled up with tears of joy as he hugged the young man good-bye. He knew this would be one of the last times he would see him before his death. But he also knew that the young man had a better grasp of heaven than he did. He had a better grasp of what heaven would be like than many people twice his age, with twice as much experience and knowledge. He KNEW that something better was coming.

At the funeral people were walking by the young man's casket and they saw the suit he was wearing and the fork placed in his right hand. Over and over, the Priest heard the question, 'What's with the fork?' And over and over he smiled. During his message, the Priest told the people of the conversation he had with the young man shortly before he died. He also told them about the fork and about what it symbolized to him. He told the people how he could not stop thinking about the fork and told them that they probably would not be able to stop thinking about it either.

He was right. So, the next time you reach down for your fork let it remind you, ever so gently, that the best is yet to come. Friends are a very rare jewel, indeed. They make you smile and encourage you to succeed. Cherish the time you have, and the memories you share. Being friends with someone is not an opportunity, but a sweet responsibility. And just remember ... keep your fork!



Happy August, Trinity! I want to take a moment to give you an overview of what has been happening at Trinity. As most of you know, I hold the volunteer position of Business Manager. The job description is still being defined, but suffice it to say, I work with staff and volunteers to coordinate and keep things running smoothly. Initially, I am taking on the giant project of accessing, prioritizing, and financing the needs that have come from several years of deferred maintenance. While others are handling the day-to-day items of getting toilets fixed or paying the bills, I am concentrating on the big picture of the things that need to be done versus the things we want to get done. I have received assistance from other volunteers in getting quotes for those needs.



With the guidance of the property team, a project plan is

being prepared. Top of the list is the sprinkler systems that water our grasses. Paradise Landscaping has put a lot of work in to the area south of the parking lot and the area around the bell tower. We are converting those areas to natural grass allowing them to grow taller resulting in less need for water and less mowing which in turn saves us money. These areas are watered by the pump in the ditch. The rest of the property is fed by City of Greeley water and it is the next area to get repaired. This will allow us to complete the landscaping along 35<sup>th</sup> Avenue on the west side of the school. We have very specific guidelines laid out by the city as to what can be done with that area. Our goal is to cut the amount of water needed and still have a great curb appeal.

Other priorities are getting the metal exterior doors of the church repaired, replacing windows in the church building, painting classrooms and other interior areas. We would also like to improve the signage, making us more visible. Of course, all these items come at a price. Having quotes will help guide us with our priorities, there is a lot of work to be done. Some projects are large enough that they may need additional fundraising to accomplish.

Please prayerfully consider increasing your giving of time, talents, and treasure as we embark on this journey together. We are in the throws of summer and our cash flow is always less without the school tuition payments. Take a moment to look at the year-end financial report also in this newsletter. Please also give thanks and praise to God for all those who already give of their time and talents handling the day to day business of our ministry.

Where did summer go???? We had some activity in the school building for the summer (VBS, Three Trees Youth Volunteers, our summer childcare class), but life was relatively quiet. Angela Horton and her assistant Anna have the building sparkling clean, ready for teachers to set up rooms and a new crop of kids to arrive.

Teachers will begin their meetings on August 5. Pray for that time spent preparing for this upcoming school year, especially since we won't have an elementary administrator in place. While Pastor and I take on some tasks, elementary teachers will also take on extra responsibilities and need to work closer together than ever. Implementing new curriculum resources for Math, Reading and Religion will add another layer of challenges. We have fabulous people, so I'm certain that it will be another great year.

On August 8, parents may bring their students to visit classrooms and we will have parent orientation. Much of July was spent with Debi, the Board and I working on handbooks and calendars and enrollment forms and a variety of resources to prepare our families for 2024-25. We will have 4 elementary classrooms plus music/art/library specials and 2 early childhood classes plus childcare.

On August II, all classroom personnel will be commissioned at early service. There will be a reception in the Fellowship Hall during the Bible study hour. Come greet Brenda, Virginia, Renee, Lydia, Debbie, Joyce, Jadyn, Tonaira, Angela and me and pray that we will be equipped for the year ahead. Keep praying that we add a couple names to this list. We need a new afternoon classroom assistant in the childcare room (Jadyn is moving to the PreK room). We would like to find someone to teach PE I or 2 afternoons each week.

The big day is August 14. We start with a traditional event called "Boo Hoo/Woo Hoo".

We often have more crying from mommies on the first day of school than children (especially in preschool and kindergarten). Most elementary parents are in the "woo hoo" category and happy to be dropping off their children for a full day of school. There will be coffee and donuts for parents to gather and commiserate from 8:00-8:30. At 8:30, we have our first chapel of the school year in the sanctuary. Please come join us any Wednesday through the school year. The theme for Lutheran schools this year is "Endure", based on Hebrews 12:1-3.

There is no Cook's Night Out in August, but in September watch for the details for the meal at the school. That event usually kicks off the annual Scholarship Drive. That evening is also a great opportunity to tour the school building since congregation members don't often have an excuse to check out anything other than the office.

Since I'm the only educator in the office this year, you will get to hear from me each month in the newsletter. Let me know if there is any topic you want me to write about. If you ever have questions about the school, you can ask me. I also wouldn't mind if you asked Renee, Virginia, Tonaira or Angela from our staff, who are also congregation members. But feel free to talk to Board members as well; Pam, Linda, Kathy, Terri, James, Laura and Margaret are always ready to talk about our school.
