A quorum was established.

Minutes: December minutes were approved with corrections via email by those in attendance prior to this meeting.

Treasurer's Report: Cheri Carsten

Financial report emailed prior to meeting for review. Discussion noting significant decline in offerings year to date. Motion by Bob and seconded by Ken to approve report as presented. After discussion, passed by voice vote.

The Board of Elders and Spiritual Ministries: Ken Clavir

- Call process: waiting for names from the District. Then will begin review of candidates.
- Budget worksheet beginning process.
- Pastor Schnegelberger will be gone January 29 and February 5th. Planning for Lent and Easter services.
- Heard reports from Angela/DCE. and Pastor Schnegelberger.

The Board of Property Ministries: Jason Reiter

- Decembers cold temperatures caused fire sprinklers to freeze and break. The damage to three school classrooms is being resolved with many helpers. Insurance claims are being processed.
- The city of Greeley now requires sidewalk snow removal at any amount (previously 2 inches) within 24 hours.
- Contractor in place to repair holes in Church front entry doors.
- New rugs in place at school and church.
- Jason gave public comment at PDC Energy's community zoom meeting on behalf of Trinity.

Board of Christian Education Ministries: Pam Clavir

- Early registration January 27 March 3.
- National Lutheran Schools week January 22-27 with reception between services.
- Kindergarten teacher interviews done, working through call process. Long term sub in place for rest of this year.
- Grants have been received for the purchase of library books, furniture, gym equipment, technology and STEAM kits, and new sinks in EC classrooms.
- The board has decided to resume work towards accreditation.
- Budget work. Increases in tuition have been approved.
- Spring musical is on May 4th.

The Board of Financial and Stewardship Ministries: Cheri Carsten

- Reviewing income projections for new budget year. Working on graph to track overall offerings over time for comparison.
- Possibility of estate planning workshop. Cheri will place information in bulletin to gauge interest.


Old Business

A Mental Health Minute

I like something that Charles Spurgeon said, "Worry doesn't empty tomorrow of its sorrows, it only empties today of its strength." That quote suggests that worry in and of itself isn't productive so I shouldn't spend too much time in it. But I also know that if I don't accept that I'm worried, I end up just laying awake at night, stress eating, and not getting anything done. So what's a person to do?

First, I have to recognize that I'm worried and say to myself, "Of course you are worried about so and so, it has the potential to affect you." And since my worry comes in the form of playing out scenarios and conversations over and over again in my head, I have to stop that so I don't drive myself crazy. "You're doing IT again. Stop." "Stop" signals my brain that I'm about to make a change. Then I make a plan. I make decisions about my worry. Should I do anything about it right now? What?

Sometimes the answer is to tell God about it and ask Him to help me put it aside. "Hey God, I'm at work. My car is broken and at the shop and I am worried about how much it is going to cost, but I have to get this project done by 3pm. Can you help me focus on my project for now since I don't know anything yet?" Sometimes the answer is to just do it right now, like when I've walked by the kitty litter three times and felt guilty about not scooping it.

Sometimes the answer is "It isn't yours." That's the hardest answer for me because it means that I really should stay out of the situation because someone else needs to work something out for themselves and my involvement might interfere with their growth. That's when I have to say "I can't but You can. Help me be present right where I am because right now my kid needs me to play Hi-Ho-Cherry-O."

This approach helps me because I feel like I'm doing something about my worry, and I don't end up letting it take over my focus or my sleep. I know that it is important to God that we trust Him. He wants us to be still and know that He is God. He also doesn't want us making something like worry more important than Him. This is my way of having something practical to help and also honor God. —Angela Riemer



Blessings prom the Heart





February is the month of Valentine's Day and a good time to remember the serving hearts of our Trinity Quilter's, who give generously of their time and talents. As 2023 has them thinking of all the exciting things they have going, here are some of the community outreaches they have contributed to in 2022:

- 91 quilts to the Victims Advocacy Program;
- 57 quilt to U C Health Comfort Care;
- 13 Walker bags that were handed out through North Range Peer Counselors;
- 26 quilts and 15 pillow cases to Uvalde Victims and their families in response to the school shooting in Uvalde, Tx;
- 24 Patriotic quilts given to The Denver VA by Cubby the Comfort Dog;
- 200+ Dog beds given to family of the quilters; the Humane Society of Greeley; the Kearney Nebraska Animal Shelter; the Cattle Dog Rescue; and there some given away for free at the Bazaar last October.
- Donations for Wings (a residential treatment home for mothers with addictions and children) included over 100 items, i.e. diaper bags, quilts for children and adults, receiving blankets, and baby clothes. Wings is run by North Range.
- This year, they once again adopted Wings for Christmas, providing gifts for 17 moms and 13 children.

This industrious group comes together on Mondays from 9 am to 10 pm. More than 40 men and women work upstairs in the school and some, even from home. Using materials from the Quilters reserves, these quilters quilt at home. One such quilter works diligently to provide baby blankets for Life Stories, a division of CASA. In 2022, 27 baby quilts were made and given to Life Stories.

Accumulatively, the Quilters have completed 7700 hours of service to R.S.V.P. for which R.S.V.P. will receive approximately \$30.00 an hour in grant money.

Here at home, the Quilters made 10 Baptismal banners for baptism's at Trinity. They also

provided a quilt for the PTL fundraiser last spring where the quilt was auctioned for over \$700.00. After the October Bazaar, the Quilters gave \$2500.00 of their earnings to the school for the Scholarship Fund to help students in need with tuition costs. Keep these wonderful people and their serving hearts in your prayers. Give thanks and praise to God for the blessing of our Trinity Quilters!


