FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

“Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, ² looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.”

Hebrews 12:1–2 (ESV)

The season of Lent and Easter can seem like an endurance race because so much is happening in our lives during this time of year. Added worship services, soup meals after each midweek morning and before each evening worship, winter moving into spring, a change to daylight savings, spring and summer activities beginning, lots of school events. Sometimes it feels like these weeks sprint by and before you know it we are celebrating Easter. Then we focus on the close of the school year. Yet, year after year we do this as we focus on what God has accomplished for us. This is an exciting time. The letter to the Hebrews says it well. We are surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses. We are to run the race with endurance. Consider those who have gone to receive their crown of righteousness in our midst during the past year or two. They too are our witnesses. I invite the Trinity family to run with endurance the race God has put before us.

In last month's newsletter the schedule for Lent was published. This month it is on the front page and by the time you receive this, we will be into the season. God has given to us “Promised Treasures,” we will focus on during the weekly midweek services. Each week we will look at a different treasure: ashes, salt, water, light, bread, palms, water and blood, and then the old rugged wooden cross. On Easter we are reminded of the promised land filled with milk and honey that is ours because of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. On the five Sundays in Lent we will have cross themes. “Cross” purpose, “Cross” questions, “Cross” roads, “Cross” currents, “Cross” way.

We praise God for His healing hand as Ken went through several different surgeries in the past few months. Ken would like to reduce the services he plays, but Debbie and Angela are willing to take on additional services. I want to shout out to Debbie Schwartz and Angela Erickson who stepped up to cover the time in Ken's absence. Trinity has been blessed with these individuals.

Yes, the principal of Trinity was called by the school in Maryville, Kansas to be their principal. He announced he will be accepting their call and will complete the school year here at Trinity. I want to personally thank him for all he has done for our school during his time here. I have been blessed to serve with him and with his wife Angela as our DCE. Notice of this meeting was given in advance to all members of the council. The meeting was called to order at 8:45 am by Angela Riemer with opening prayer and devotion led by Jason.

Minutes: January minutes were approved with corrections via email by those in attendance prior to this meeting for inclusion in the Tidings Newsletter.

Treasurer's Report: Cheri Carsten

Financial report emailed prior to meeting for review. Motion by Brenda, seconded by Bob to approve report as presented. Discussion followed. Passed by voice vote.

The Board of Elders and Spiritual Ministries: Pastor Schnegelberger

- Call process update
- Lent and Easter themes planned and approved.
- DCE report

The Board of Property Ministries: Jason Reiter

- Need volunteers to mow property this summer.
- Working on inventory of church contents for insurance purposes.
- Planning workdays beginning in April.

Board of Christian Education Ministries: Pam Clavir

- Have received counsel regarding calling new principal. Next steps in place.

The Board of Financial and Stewardship Ministries: Cheri Carsten

- Cheri moved that we offer a contract for accounting eight hours per week. Twenty more weeks in this fiscal year = 160 hours at \$20 per hour = \$3200.00. Upon approval by this board, will include this contract in the Finance Board budget for the next fiscal year. Motion seconded by Pam. Discussion followed. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote.
- The final budget draft will be presented at the March council meeting to be ready for approval by the congregation at the March voter's meeting.
- Board members are preparing an attendance and offering report to present to the congregation in March.

1. Wheelchair lift: Bob reported on status. No action taken. Will continue to discuss how to move forward with this and other special projects at next meeting.
2. Angela provided additional documentation requested by the Rocky Mountain District supporting review of our newly approved constitution/bylaws.

There being no further business to bring before the board, the meeting was adjourned at 10:50 am. The meeting closed with prayer by Jason.

School Happenings

Preschool & K-8

We're down to the final trimester of the school year! There's a lot going on . . . here are the headlines:

Mrs. Ewald is on maternity leave: We have shuffled the preschool staff schedules and added Angela Riemer 3 mornings a week to get us through until summer.

We have added 8 more preschool students since Christmas: Four of those students attend 5-day full-days! A couple of them are young and will be in our preschool another 2 ½ years. A couple of them joined us now because they want to attend kindergarten here next year.

A new kindergarten teacher is being called: Mrs. Renee Ortado will be joining the school staff this summer. Renee brings a wealth of experience to our program, most recently serving as early childhood director and preschool teacher at Christ Lutheran in Denver. If you have friends or family interested in kindergarten, we have an open house on Thursday, March 9, from 3:45-6:00.

The search is on for a new principal: Kyle will be leaving in June to become principal at Good Shepherd Lutheran School in Marysville, KS. The BOCE has already had meetings with staff, parents, leadership and our district education executive. They are starting to advertise the position on various platforms and are ready to collect names. If you have a potential candidate, get the name to Linda Klipp or Pam Clavir. Simultaneously, the BOCE is creating plans for if we do not have a principal in place when the school year begins in August.

We are not participating in Universal Pre-K this first year: Gwen has been attending a variety of meetings on the topic. There are still more questions than answers . . . and it is a big problem that you don't get the same answer each time you ask the question! The biggest issues at this time revolve around "equity" in accepting students into the program and guidelines for the learning environment. You are also asked to sign a contract to participate in quality rating and community input when they haven't developed any guidelines for either of those components. Gwen will continue to stay involved in the information loop. If they work out some of the problems and concerns, we could sign up in the future. So far, we have had NO inquiries from parents about UPK.

Rehearsals have begun for the school musical: The Jungle Book will have 2 performances on Thursday, May 4. Plan to come to the school gym at 10:00 a.m. or 6:30 p.m. There will be a silent/live auction at the evening performance.

Summer childcare is on the horizon: We will offer summer preschool and childcare for students who haven't yet started kindergarten. Enrollment information will be available in the office after spring break.

Water damage is being repaired: The classrooms affected by the burst pipes in December have new walls and ceilings. Carpet is ordered. The final piece will be replacing cabinets. Mrs. Jaynes should be able to return to her classroom soon.

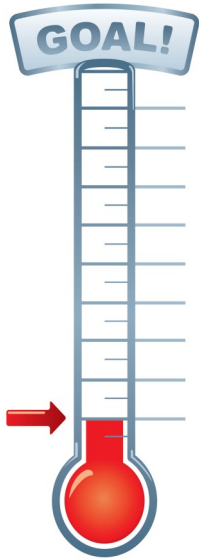
SPRING BREAK IS COMING: The elementary teachers will be off the week of March 13. Childcare will still be offered March 13-16, but will be closed on the 17th to give our preschool staff a 3-day weekend. At least that is the plan. Since Gwen arrived as director, here is the spring break history: 2019 – bomb cyclone, 2020 – covid shut down begins, 2021 – blizzard shuts down everything for a couple days, and 2022 – stomach bug ravages staff and students so that we have to close a couple days because we don't have workers! Please pray that 2023 spring break is very uneventful for Gwen and the preschool staff!

Note from the Editor: As I write this, the Season of Lent has begun. Not in the traditional way that we are used to. Snow and a ice cancelled the Ash Wednesday services, but nonetheless Lent has begun. Often the 40 days of Lent are focused on repentance as we study Jesus' years of ministry which emphasize our need for a Savior, but something else came to my mind as I was writing this and that is HOPE. In today's culture, hope is little more than a wish, but in the Old Testament it means "to trust and wait expectantly". In the New Testament, hope is invested in and focused on someone—the person of Jesus. That baby in a manger came as the HOPE of the world, a promise long awaited. In a world of almost daily mass shootings, rampant inflation, job shortages and other seemingly hopeless situations, perhaps this is also a time to reflect on the HOPE that Jesus brings. Time to trust in the Lord as we wait with expectation that His promises will be fulfilled. Time to invest in and focus on Jesus who at the end of these 40 days of reflection, will willingly lay down His life for us on the cross, the sacrificial lamb shedding His blood for our sins. *"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope."* Romans 15:13

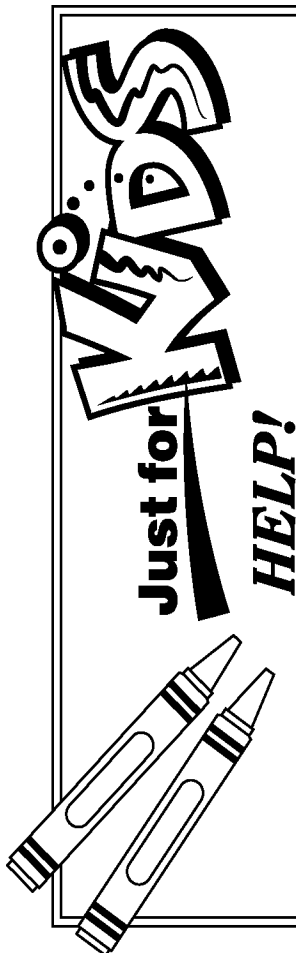
