Do it in faith, and it will be the adventure of your life.

The fall season is finally officially here. Fall kicks off our official "scholarship season". A variety of supporters of Trinity Lutheran School – board members, teachers and parents – will be promoting our school on Sundays, letting you know more about what is happening not just at Trinity, but in Lutheran education in general. I had the pleasure of talking to the LWML about this topic in September and I'm always happy to talk to you about any aspect of Lutheran education. Our scholarship fund helps many families who can't afford our full tuition, and Trinity has a long-standing tradition of helping parents over that financial hurdle and not letting the cost be a barrier that keeps a child from getting a quality Christian education.

We kicked of the scholarship campaign with the Cook's Night Out; thanks to all of you who contributed then. Your next chance to eat out AND support the scholarship fund will be at the Quilters Bazaar on October 19. When you are here shopping, stop by the school cafeteria to enjoy the baked potato bar. Watch your bulletin for where we have our first restaurant Cook's Night Out.

The Fall Festival is scheduled for Saturday, October 26, from 11 am. To 1 p.m. There is a promotional page in this newsletter and there will be reminders in the October bulletins. You can come just for lunch or come just to bring your kids or grandkids to Trunk-or-Treat. Pray for a beautiful day so that the kids' activities can be outside. We are inviting other Lutheran congregations in the Greeley area to this event. We want to show off our school and network with other Lutherans in the area. And we all know that food, fellowship and fun appeals to the Lutheran crowd!

Watch for the school bulletin board to be updated this month. School pictures were taken in late September so we will have updated staff photos. We will also add teacher wish-lists to the board. With all of the new curriculum we implemented this year, we are finding that we lack some resources, especially in the areas of science materials and updated literature choices. I've asked teachers to create lists so that we can tap into our church and school community to find resources.

If you want to keep up with what is happening at the school, you can also follow us on Facebook. Look for Trinity Lutheran School and Preschool. I try to post something weekly about a school happening. In September, you could have learned about the joys of playdough (my preschool class) or seen the beautiful moment when the Mission Circle presented the second and third grade students with Bibles (which is definitely my biggest highlight so far this year).

Praise God and be thankful that we have such a dedicated staff pulling together this year, dealing with hurdles like new curriculum and technology glitches, but celebrating the little joys of day-to-day life in a school. We start each school day in God's word and praying together, which is a key to our strength. We can also feel the support from a congregation that keeps us in prayer and gives us encouragement. I thank God each day that I have the privilege to serve at Trinity Lutheran Church and School.

Scholarship Fundraising Campaign!

Our annual Scholarship Fundraising Campaign has begun! We give thanks and praise to God for your generous donations in past years and pray that He will open your hearts again to help us meet our goal of \$50,000 this year. God continues to bless Trinity and its mission, Trinity Lutheran School. Our focus this year is on Faith, Family, and Foundations. Everyday our students learn about Jesus. They work and play together as family and they are learning the things that make a strong foundation for a Successful future.

This year we have 44 students enrolled in K-5 and 17 of those students need assistance. The tuition this year is \$4200 for the year and some of our families need just a little help, while others need the full \$420 per month. To keep our scholarship families invested in their child's education, they are asked to do community service hours at Trinity. They cheerfully give of their time, painting, pulling weeds, organizing fundraisers through the PTL, and odd jobs that pop up from time to time. We are always looking for things they can do for their hours and welcome any suggestions.

Daily we experience the spiritual warfare of this world. Our mission is to share the good news of God's love for all mankind, in hope that all mankind will seek and know our Lord and Savior. Our prayer is that we never have to turn a student away simply because they do not have the money for tuition. Our example is Christ himself who was born in a lowly manger and served not the wealthy, but rather those who were not. This year our goal is to raise \$50,000. Please prayerfully consider your blessings and giving to the Scholarship Fund.


