

This year's theme begins a four-year cycle focusing on the LWML Mission Statement — As Lutheran Women in Mission, we joyfully proclaim Christ, support missions, and equip women to honor God by serving others. For Lutheran Women in Mission Sunday 2025 we focus on Proclaiming Christ.

Everything we do as Lutheran Women in Mission begins with Christ's message of repentance and forgiveness. The Ascension text of "GO" (Luke 24:44–53) is the mission emphasis for Lutheran Women in Mission Sunday 2025. On Ascension Day, Jesus gave his followers an assignment "that repentance and forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations." We, as the church of the Lord Jesus Christ, have a responsibility to proclaim the message of Christ, to be that body which proclaims repentance and

forgiveness, showing forth the merciful Christ in what we do and say. As Lutheran Women in Mission we continue to support, encourage and uplift missionaries, and also provide physical support and compassion to all people. It is the proclamation of repentance and forgiveness of sins in Jesus' name that motivates us to do this work. All Glory be to Jesus!

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Now Is the Time

We live in a moment when clarity and purpose are desperately needed. It is not enough to circle the wagons and retreat into safety—we are called to act, to live decisively in the truth of Jesus Christ.

Recently, I have been struck by the boldness of Charlie Kirk as he spoke to college students about family and responsibility. I am not pointing to his political affiliations but to his willingness to confront illusions with reality, to reignite in young people the courage to live with purpose for the sake of those around them. He saw students caught up in ideologies that deny truth and fracture lives. Rather than standing at a distance, he went to them—seeking to win them over to reality and to awaken observers to speak and live more boldly themselves.

This is the kind of purposefulness to which Christ calls us—not only to stand for truth with words, but also to act in private and public, in humility and boldness, by taking up our cross and following Him. God graciously invites us into His own work of mercy and grace. Our neighbor needs it. Our community needs it.

At Trinity, we have a special opportunity. God has united us as a body in Jesus Christ for a purpose. Each of us has relationships and vocations in which we are called to live with purpose. But together, our impact is multiplied. Our school is a vivid example: a costly and complex ministry in which we train the youngest among us in the mind of Christ. We are cultivating leaders who will provide strength and stability in families, churches, and communities for years to come.

Opportunities are all around us. We could welcome UNC students with a meal and friendship, strengthen bonds across generations, and care more intentionally for the elderly in our church and community. No one can do it all; but together as Christ's body, we can do more. And still, our confidence is not in ourselves but in Him. Christ is our Head, our life, and our purpose. Let us look to Him, take up our cross, and follow wherever He leads.

Happy October, Trinity!

I want to take a moment to bring you up to speed on a few things that have been happening in the last few months here at Trinity.

There has been a lot of interest in the "look" of the property, especially the grassy areas. The plan was undertaken to do our part in our community to conserve water. The area south of the parking lot has been restored to "native grass" and while some times it may look unkept in comparison to the vivid green lawn by the church, it is meant to be reminiscent of prairie grass. It allows us to water less and mow less, cutting costs. The same applies to the area around the bell tower. The big project along 35th avenue west of the school has been completed. You may notice a lot of weeds in the new seeding area, they will be treated next spring. In the meantime think of the parable Jesus told in Matthew 13:24-43, if we pull out the weeds before the grass is established, we risk losing the grass as well. Be patient and give Trinity some grace and mercy.

The property team is putting together information for the next phase of their plans for the property. The property team is looking at projects they can do themselves were they can spend a little less, but still make a big impact. With fall here and winter not far behind, that may mean taking a break or working on interior projects. It's still a work in progress.

We are also coming to the end of our 1st quarter of this fiscal year. As is usual, the offerings were down in June, July, August, and so far in September. In addition, we have had to do emergency repairs on both roofs after the summer hail storms. Our insurance for wind and hail has a \$50,000 deductible, so we had to pay for these repairs ourselves. We are seeing a 20% increase almost across the board as vendors compensate for higher costs due to inflation and tariffs. Our income through offerings, tuition, and gifts needs to cover our monthly that include payroll, taxes, benefits, utilities, mortgage and insurance, as well as those pesky unexpected expenses.

Last week, Pastor Woodward reminded us in his sermon that we are a family, a flock, named Trinity and together we have agreed to move forward with growing our church. That includes another pastor and a deficit budget. He commended us, because that shows we have faith. Faith is a gift from God, but that doesn't mean we just sit back and do nothing. Faith leads to trusting in God, knowing that His will, will be done. That means paying attention when He nudges us to give a bit more, or help with things around the property, giving of our time and talents, having faith that our personal needs and home life will be provided for. Please pray to our Lord and see how He might lead you to use your gifts to serve our ministry here at Trinity.
