Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. Neither he nor his mission changes. He is the image of God in whom we were created, the one we now behold by faith, and as we look to him, the Spirit shapes us "from glory to glory" (2 Cor. 3:18). Christ has not stopped working—he is still forming his people, conforming us to his image.

And yet, we often feel like we live in unusual times. Our culture tells a story of progress—from the so-called dark ages to the age of enlightenment, from oppression to freedom, from sickness to modern medicine. It's hard to imagine life without air conditioning, smartphones, or even electricity. We have gained remarkable control over our outward circumstances, and we benefit from that in many ways.

But along with this mastery of the material world, we also feel a loss of meaning. The other day, I overheard several adults of different ages lamenting how little respect children show these days. That's not true of every child, of course, but it does reflect a deeper worry that something essential is slipping away. Despite all our modern comforts, depression and anxiety are increasing. Families grow more fragile. Fewer young people are getting married and raising children. Outwardly, life may look better, but spiritually we are no healthier.

Our age prizes efficiency, productivity, and control. But the Christian life is different—it is receptive. It is slow and patient. It grows not by seizing and mastering but by receiving and treasuring what God gives. Real life is found by turning our attention to Jesus, through his Word and Spirit, through worship and prayer, through the fear and love of God.

On September 7, I'll begin a new Sunday morning study called *The Catechumenate*. The word "catechesis" comes from the Greek and means "to echo down." My prayer is that God's Word would echo down into our hearts, drawing us deeper into Christ. Together we will explore Scripture, the catechism, and the liturgy so that our hearts, minds, and outward lives are more fully conformed to his image, and so that, in turn, we are equipped to bless and teach others—in our families, our friendships, and our communities.

I am deeply grateful for our Trinity family—for your support, your prayers, and your partnership in the ministry of the gospel. It is a joy to walk together as Christ shapes us and makes us his own.

I. **OPENING** The meeting opened with devotion and prayer by Ken. **MINUTES** March meeting minutes previously approved through email.

II. OLD BUSINESS

- Annual financial report emailed prior to meeting for review.
- Matt moved we approve this report as presented. Seconded by Ken. Discussion. Motion passed by voice vote.
- April, May, and June business was managed through email discussions. No action taken.

III. REPORTS

a. Volunteer Business Manager: Cheri Carsten

Reports were sent to Council members by email in advance. Discussion with questions answered. Cheri
has resigned from this position as of June 30, 2025. She has distributed her duties and provided support.
Specifics reviewed by Council. Thank-you expressed to Cheri. Matt will take on scheduling Security and
planning for security training at school and church. Carpet tiles will be installed in the Narthex area being
paid for by LWML Easter Love Offerings.

b. School Board: Pam Clavir Co-Chairs

- Report not sent in advance School Board meeting this next Monday.
- Debbie Schwartz is eligible for a divine call.
- Tonaria Ewald will continue to serve as a Preschool teacher.
- Editing Employee Handbook (including discounts for Employees with children in the school).
- Foundry (Homeschool program) is growing.
- New reading and language arts curriculum has been purchased; teachers will undergo training.

c. Pastor and Elders: Ken Clavir, Chair

- Ken has met with Pastor Vanderhyde to review expectations moving forward.
- Elders have established a time schedule for calling our second Pastor. Elders agreed that the new Pastor's primary focus will be on the church and congregation. The Elders will identify specific roles and duties. Ken will provide more details about the process to the congregation.
- Call committee (established by Elders per our constitution/bylaws) will consist of three Elders, a member of Council, and three at-large members from the congregational assembly.
- After discussion, President Matt Foster was selected to represent Council on the Call committee.

IV. POLICY REVIEW Church Council Policy Manual

- Discussed how to manage and document changes to policies.
- Church Administrative assistant (Debi) and Congregational Secretary (Brenda) currently maintain updated copies.

V. NEW BUSINESS

- Mortgage Discussion report by Cathy Turley. After discussing three options provided by Cathy, Council agreed that we continue the current payment structure for paying the mortgage.
- Solar Panel Discussion: Council considered a proposal (brought by the company GRP/Wegman) and decided not to proceed.
- Memorial Wall Paining Update: Lighting and names will be added. A reception for the artist Scott Chartier and woodworker Tim Turner will be hosted when complete.
- Business Manager Discussion Cheri shared a proposal from Pastor Vanderhyde "Adjusting Compensation and Organizational Roles to Support Growth and Sustainability." No action taken.
- Property Team representation at Council Meetings. Matt will invite the team leaders to report to our meetings.






